Since its creation in 1947, CIDEF - which is part of the Faculty of Humanities - offers students and teachers from around the world various programs in French language and culture. CIDEF has been granted the Qualité FLE label (French as a Foreign Language quality certification) and is an examination centre for certifications and university diplomas.

UNIVERSITY DIPLOMA

IN FRENCH LANGUAGE AND FRANCOPHONE CULTURES

Course content

After taking a **placement test**, students are placed in a **language course** corresponding to their **level** (ranging from level A1 to level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). About 20 students per French language class.

Electives can be chosen depending on students' language level, the current trimester or semester, areas of interest, and personal or academic requirements. These electives represent **3 hours** per week on a total of **21 contact hours** per week.

A certificate is given to the students who attend less than 21 hours per week.

À LA CARTE COURSE

At CIDEF

This course is designed for:

- Anyone over 18 wishing to study French language and the culture of French-speaking countries for one or several weeks at any time of the year. After taking a placement test, students are placed in a language course and, depending on their level, they can take general French language, French culture or French for specific purposes classes. They can attend up to 21 contact hours per week.
- **Groups** wishing to learn a language abroad at any time of the year. The course content and schedule are worked out in collaboration with the group coordinator. Depending on demand, this course may include general French classes, French for specific purposes, cultural activities and excursions.

Online

This course aims to consolidate the students' language skills as well as their knowledge of French culture. After a placement test, the students may access online teaching tools available on an e-learning platform.

Course content is offered through various pedagogical modules that include:

- written and oral comprehension
- grammar, vocabulary and phonetics
- writing skills

Students work at their own ability level and pace according to a schedule specifying the expected time frame and deadlines

On request students may receive support from a teacher to assist them when necessary.



UNIVERSITY DIPLOMA

PREPARATION FOR ACADEMIC STUDIES

Course content

This diploma prepares international students for university degree programmes. Students have the opportunity to acquire language, cultural and methodological skills, notably through subject-specific courses, so to have the prerequisites necessary for joining French Universities.

UNIVERSITY DIPLOMA

PEDAGOGICAL TOOLS AND PRACTICES FOR FFL TEACHER TRAINING

Course content

This **distance learning** course is designed to give the FFL teacher or student teacher the **necessary methodological, didactic and pedagogical fundamentals.** The aim is to consider and reflect upon the processes and strategies at work when you teach/learn a language. This is complemented by a work placement (for student teachers) or a **professional experience** (for teachers) so as to analyze one's own perception and approach of teaching.

The university diploma requires completion of 7 modules (including 6 cores modules) and a professional experience report.

Core modules

Planning a teaching session

- distinguishing between the initial situation
 the expected learning outcomes
- setting objectives & sub-objectives
- · choosing the right assessment for the teaching goals
- · choosing a class activity
- · choosing adapted class material

Teaching grammar

- understanding the "grammar" we teach
- · choosing an approach to teaching grammar
- choosing grammar points according to the set objectives
- designing a sampling phase
- · defining the type of activities envisaged

Learning how to assess students' production

- distinguishing between diagnostic assessment, formative evaluation & summative evaluation
- becoming acquainted with skills assessment
- · designing an assessment chart
- introducing students to self-assessment
- · building a positive culture of assessment

Fostering a dynamic learning process

- getting acquainted with the concept of cohesion
- distinguishing between cooperation & collaboration
- understanding what is meant by "group"
- learning how to manage and motivate a group
- suggesting activities towards a cultural project

Teaching phonetics

- introducing fundamental notions
- understanding the importance of rhythm and connected speech
- getting acquainted with the phonological specificities of French
- · conceptualizing phoneme articulation
- considering best practices in terms of students' progress and assessment

Developing effective learning strategies

- singling out abilities and learning styles
- getting to know the useful strategies according to the various skills
- targeting strategies to be implemented
- · offering practical tools
- taking a reflective stance

French for specific purposes

- distinguishing between FFL / FOS (specific purposes) / FLP (professional-oriented) & français de spécialité (specialized)
- making sense of case studies
- building a curriculum

Learning languages through games

- getting acquainted with the notion of game
- distinguishing between recreational activity, educational game & classroom game
- understanding game-based pedagogy and its pertinent environment
- becoming acquainted with material adapted to game-based pedagogy
- devise a game for the class

Course schedule

The university diploma is implemented over a two-year period.

Each year CIDEF offers a schedule including 4 modules (each module represents about 20h over a 5-week period). At the end of the two-year period, the teacher or student teacher must have completed a work placement or professional experience for a minimum of 100h.

TEACHER TRAINING

Training in your own school

CIDEF offers training courses by experienced instructors (teachers, lecturers, textbook writers, instructional designers, teachers of non-linguistic subjects) who come to your school for training sessions.

For those training sessions:

- subjects are specifically adapted to the needs and requirements of each group
- the number of contact hours and the duration of the course are flexible
- the teaching methods are varied (workshops on specific subjects, best practices, specific linguistic difficulties and issues of French)
- → CIDEF offers a **certificate of attendance** at the end of the training session
- → CIDEF also offers such training sessions in Angers

Online training

CIDEF offers online learning tools - designed by experienced instructors - available on an e-learning platform. Those asynchronous learning courses include theoretical videos, practical material (worksheets, online activities), complementary readings and group activities (forum, padlet, tag clouds...). Each module represents 20h over a period of 5 weeks, is supervised by an instructor.

CIDEF offers classes preparing for:

The DELF and DALF diplomas are valid indefinitely and recognized internationally.

The TCF certification is valid for two years.

- 1 Registration form: to be filled in, signed (by the parents if the student is under-age) and returned online, by mail or email. Registration possible at the CIDEF secretariat.
- 2 Tuition fees deposit*: 350 € and 120 € application fees per session.
- 3 Accommodation deposit*: 350 € if you book accommodation through CIDEF.
- **4 Documents to be attached:** a photocopy of your passport + a high school diploma or a document proving your registration in your home university + a copy of your private insurance for the entire period.

CONDITIONS

- Be 18 years old or be under the responsibility of an adult for the entire duration of the program
- · Have a high school diploma
- Arrive at the beginning of each session (beginner students only)

PAYMENT CONDITIONS

The tuition fees must be fully paid prior to arrival. Payment can be made by transfer, by foreign bank checque, by checque, in cash or by credit card at CIDEF.

CANCELLATIONS CONDITIONS

- All course sessions started are due.
- Registration fees and deposits are non-refundable.
- In case of visa refusal (letter from the French Embassy to be attached), the advanced payment of tuition fees will be reimbursed upon presentation of a bank account number. An amount of 470 € (+ 350 € for accommodation) will be retained by CIDEF.
- In case of visa acceptance but cancellation by the student, no refund will be made.
